Reitz Theater to present 'Sweeney Todd'

Reitz Theater of CRI in DuBois will be presenting "Sweeney Todd" in a couple weeks, just a couple months removed from a successful production of "The Guy Who Didn't Like Musicals."

"Sweeney Todd" will premiere on July 10 and run through July 12, then pick up again on July 16-18. All shows will begin at 7 p.m. with the exception of July 12, which will be a Sunday matinee show at 2 p.m.

Much like "The Guy Who Didn't Like Musicals," "Sweeney Todd" will have some explicit material and obscene language, according to Reitz Theater media specialist and board member Andy Benson.

Benson describes Sweeney Todd as "a violent thriller type of musical."

"It's not exactly for kids," Benson said.

The Stephen Sondheim classic musical is set in the 1840s in London on Fleet Street where Sweeney Todd is a barber. Todd murders his customers while in the barber chair.

The film "Sweeney Todd," which was released in 2007 and starred Johnny Depp, likely made the musical even more popular than it already was. The musical opened on Broadway in 1979, and in the West End in 1980.

"I think that will hopefully help with the tickets," Benson said of the popular movie.

Reitz Theater has kept with the theme of having an edgy side of its productions this season. Most have had dark comedy or satire, and at times have had a dark nature in general.

"We thought we'd kind of do some experimentation and see what

people want to come see," Benson said.

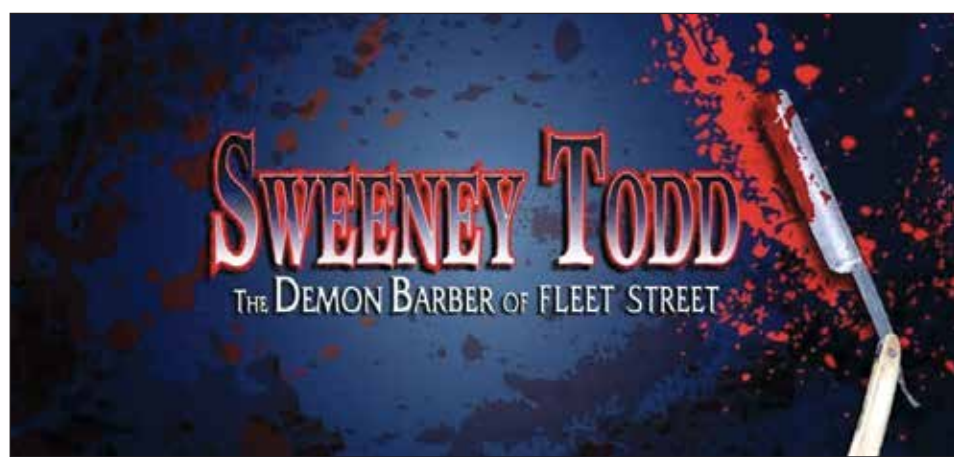
"Sweeney Todd" is a more well-known show than a lot of others. ("The Guy Who Didn't Like Musicals" was definitely more obscure, but the younger generations definitely were fans of it. This is more of a classic that older and younger people will come see."

Benson has said that the music that needs to be learned by the cast has been a challenge.

"They're doing a great job, but they have their work cut out for them, that's for sure," he said.

Benson noted that since it is a setting in the 1840s in London, there will be differences than most plays. Costumes will be from that time, and characters may talk differently than in the present-day world.

"Any time there's a period piece like that, I think people want to come see it," Benson

said. "It's taking you somewhere else. It's not just a modern-day story."

One of the challenges of doing "Sweeney Todd" is the turnaround from the previous musical, which was presented in April. Auditions were done right after "The Guy Who Didn't Like Musicals" was completed, and rehearsal started shortly after auditions.

While there are a few actors that were in the last musical, many have taken at least one or two of the previous performances away from the stage.

"There's always people to pick from and a good amount of people to work with," Benson said. "It's just a matter of what people want to devote their time to."

If people want to get involved at Reitz Theater, all they need to do is stop by on East Scribner Avenue in DuBois and ask questions, according to Benson.

"If someone has done 100 musicals, they can do another one," Benson said. "If somebody has never done one before, they can stop in and learn how."

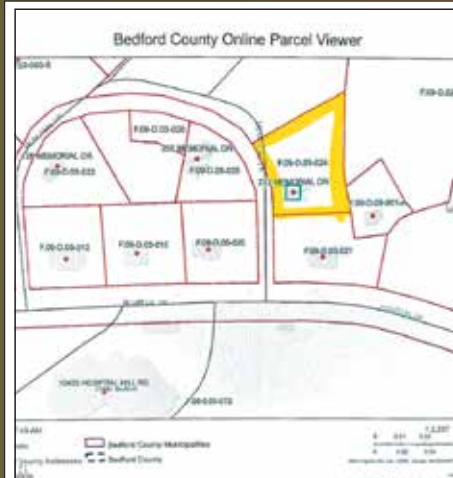

GRILLING

How to choose a grill that's best for you

Grilling is a warm weather tradition, particularly when entertaining. Cooking food outside while guests gather and mingle sets a scene for a fun summertime event. It also is a great way to cook meals and avoid heating up the home when outdoor temperatures rise.

Few things match the taste of freshly grilled foods, which can be prepared and cooked to perfection on grills that range from traditional charcoal grills to gas grills and more. The following rundown of grills can help homeowners identify which style is best for them.

•Charcoal grills: Charcoal grills have been around for some time, and they tend to be inexpensive and easy to use. Charcoal grills enable air to enter a manually adjusted intake at the bottom of the grill. Foodies claim that the only way to grill is with charcoal, which imparts a smoky, rich flavor. Charcoal kettle grills are a subset of charcoal grills that are lightweight and portable.

•Gas grills: Gas grills either use a propane tank for fuel, or are directly connected to a home's natural gas line to offer continuous availability of gas. According to The Home Depot, gas grills are prized because they heat up quickly and are very easy to use. Most come with a push-button ignition to light the grill, and heat can be easily regulated with control knobs. Some gas grills also come equipped with side burners, so that food can be boiled or reheated outside while a main course is being cooked.

•Kamado grills: Known as ceramic cookers or egg grills, Kamado grills are a more sophisticated version of a charcoal grill, according

to Build with Ferguson, a home improvement retailer. While they are still operated similarly to other charcoal grills, the engineered design and ceramic material causes much more regulated and insulated temperatures inside.

•Wood pellet grills: Pellet grills bring the best of both worlds of smoking and grilling. Pellets the size of peas are loaded into a hopper and go into a burn pot with an auger. The thermostat and burn pot work electronically to keep the grill at the desired temperature. Pellet grills are good for foods that require longer cook times, like roasts and ribs. Some models allow users to adjust the temperature of the grill and monitor food using a smartphone app.

•Electric grills: As the name implies, these grills are plugged into a nearby outlet. Electric grills are compact and portable, and some are even tabletop models. Electric grills may be ideal for apartment dwellers or those who do not have adequate outdoor space for another type of grill.

•Smoker: Standalone smokers are designed to cook foods at low temperatures over long periods of time to produce fall-off-the-bone results. Heat for smokers may be provided by wood, charcoal, electricity, or propane. Wood chips customarily are added for aromatic, authentic flavors. Although charcoal smokers are more traditional, they need to be monitored quite a bit. Electronic models may have a set-and-forget function that enables less hands-on time around the smoker, much in the way a slow cooker indoors can be set up and left without a need for monitoring.

DID YOU KNOW?

Fans of grilled food may insist grilling is an art form, and there are tricks of the trade that suggest producing delicious foods cooked over an open flame is more complicated than novices may think. Seasoning a grill is one such endeavor. Novices may not know what goes into seasoning a grill, but doing so can make it easier to remove cooked foods from grates that can become sticky as grills are used with greater frequency. Seasoning a grill involves oiling its cooking surfaces and warming it. Some grill manufacturers even recommend seasoning brand new grills prior to using them. Various cooking oils can suffice when seasoning a grill, but the grilling experts at ThermoPro advise using an oil with a high smoking point. When applying oil to the grates, users can utilize a basting brush, rag or even a spray bottle. Once the oil has been applied, heat the grill, without any food on it, for roughly 30 minutes, or until the oil begins to smoke or burn.

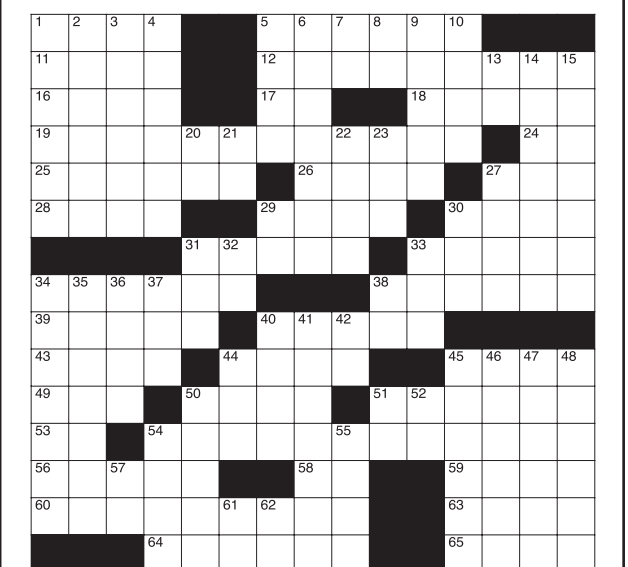

Store seeks dismal of lawsuit over gun used in killing

Mother of slain man seeks to hold gun shop, manufacturer accountable for death

The parent corporation of a Clearfield firearms store has asked a federal judge to dismiss a lawsuit brought by the mother of a murder victim, who claims the company and the store had a duty to prevent the alleged "straw purchase" of the gun used in the killing.

The lawsuit was filed earlier this year by Jodi Lynn Parks of Clearfield County.

Her son, Kodey Lee Parks, 33, was shot to death on Feb. 24, 2024, during a custody exchange with his estranged wife, Danielle Parks, and her boyfriend, Bryan Michaelis, in a home in Morris Township.

Michaelis, it was charged, used a gun purchased the day before at a

Rural King firearms store located at 260 Plaza Drive, Clearfield.

According to a lawsuit filed by the mother, Michaelis was an individual with a criminal record which barred him from purchasing and possessing a firearm.

Danielle purchased the gun, and, the lawsuit charged, handed it to Michaelis while the couple was still in the store.

The Parks lawsuit contends that Rural King employees had a duty "to pick up on, and intervene on the suspicious activity of Parks and Michaelis while inside the store."

But, Rural King, through Pittsburgh attorney Kevin C. Harkins has asked U.S. District Judge Stephanie L. Haines to dismiss the lawsuit.

The attorney for Rural King argued that federal law, through the Protection of Lawful Commerce in Arms Act, bars lawsuits like this one against manufacturers and sellers of firearms.

The legislation was passed in 2005 by Congress to curb the many lawsuits being brought against gun companies based on the misuse of firearms by third parties, including criminals.

Rural King reported that the Pennsylvania Supreme Court, in a decision last year, confirmed the constitutionality of the federal law.

Also, Rural King maintains "there is no duty to protect individuals from the unforeseeable acts of third parties — absent a special relationship."

The Rural King answer explained: "There is no basis to conclude based

on allegations in the (Parks lawsuit) that Rural King was a substantial factor in bringing about the murder of Mr. Parks."

It emphasized the federal law protecting manufacturers and sellers of arms "prohibits this case from being brought in any Federal or State Court."

The answer concluded, "The pleading of Rural King's sale practices is far too remote from the shooting of Mr. Parks to constitute a substantial factor in bringing it about."

The mother's lawsuit not only names Rural King as a defendant but also includes KelTec Industries of Florida, the compa-

ny that manufactured the P-17 semiautomatic pistol used in the Parks killing.

KelTec is also seeking dismissal of the Parks lawsuit, contending it is protected from lawsuit by the PCLAA.

And, it maintains there is "no duty to protect individuals from unforeseeable criminal acts of third parties."

KelTec is being represented by Pittsburgh attorney Darren M. Newberry.

In an order issued this week, Haines indicated Jodi Parks has until June to respond to the KelTec request to dismiss by June 23.

Both Danielle Parks and Bryan Michaelis are serving life terms for the murder of Kodey Lee Parks.

Michaelis is incarcerated in the State Correctional Institution in Fayette County while Danielle Parks is in SCI Muncy.

Forward motion

Penn State Altoona instructor who pioneered dance studies minor retires after 28 years

Dance is more than an activity, according to longtime dance artist and educator at Penn State Altoona, KT Huckabee.

"I truly believe that if you're breathing, you're dancing," she said. "You are never still. Your heart is beating. You're breathing."

Bringing the dance studies minor to the university in 1998, Huckabee applied this philosophy across all classes for 28 years as chair of the Integrative Arts major and coordinator of the dance studies minor, teaching students that dance can be a form of self-expression rather than a stage presence.

As she anticipates her retirement at the end of this month, she hopes for the dance minor's flourishing while celebrating her life's work, continuing as artistic director of Allied Motion Dance Co. and eventually becoming a professor emeritus.

"So being able to keep dance in my life, I'm honored, grateful, and I'm not done," she said. It was a nun who first inspired Huckabee to begin dancing while attending Our Lady of Victory Catholic School during the 1970s in State College.

Sister Natalie was formerly a Broadway dancer, so she annually held a spring solo and incorporated class participation.

Coming from a family of 11 children, Huckabee said she didn't have enough money to regularly enroll in dance classes. However, she auditioned against students with previous dance experience and secured the solo part.

She remembered wearing a purple costume on the stage while performing the soft ballet or lyrical performance to Simon and Garfunkel's song, "Bridge Over Troubled Water."

"That was it," she said. "I never looked back."

Following her first solo performance, she enrolled in a tap class taught by an acquaintance of Sister Natalie's before taking classes at the Central Pennsylvania Dance Workshop.

While attending State College High School, she also enrolled in dance

classes taught at University Park and secured a few college credits before moving to Point Park University in the fall of 1980.

As a dance major in the early 1980s, she said Point Park University's program promoted a negative attitude toward body image, making Huckabee feel that she couldn't be considered a dancer without looking a certain way.

This attitude caused her to rethink her career path for a short time before ultimately overcoming that mindset and enrolling in Eastern Carolina University instead.

"Why am I going to give them the power to tell me what dance is? And if I fit or don't fit," she asked rhetorically.

At Eastern Carolina, she met instructor Patti Weeks, who helped her rediscover her love of dance when taking modern dance classes.

"She is the one I will attribute to helping me find again the joy that I found when I first started dancing, that expression," she said.

She forged a path as a modern dancer, which is an artist who explores all types of dance with an emphasis on taking classes that speak to someone's unique style.

Huckabee realized that her love of dancing doesn't lie in professional performance but rather in teaching and choreography. With those goals in mind, she applied to the University of North Carolina at Greensboro and received a Master's of Fine Arts degree in 1987.

She taught at various universities across the East Coast throughout the early 1990s before returning to State College in 1995 and teaching dance alongside the former instructor she had taken lessons from in high school.

Meanwhile, she attended the Laban-Bartenieff Institute of Movement Studies in New York City for a weekend once a month for two years, attaining her certification as a Laban Movement Analyst.

In 1997, PSU Altoona became a four-year college and began an integrative arts major, but they only offered theatre and music classes, she said. Aware of the transition, Huckabee called the university and asked about including dance classes as well.

"And they said, 'Oh, we never thought about it. Sure, sure. Come on down,'" she said tongue-in-cheek.

Developing dance

As a new faculty member at PSU Altoona, Huckabee developed all of her classes, some influenced by courses at University Park and others influenced by the Laban-Bartenieff method that would

count toward a dance minor.

She encouraged students to explore their own creativity when it came to choreography, as she often entered the classroom without a pre-planned routine but asked her students to improvise and see what movements were created on the spot.

She said students with all levels of previous dance experience came together to construct a creative routine in classes.

"It's always looking for that enhancement, but the authenticity of the group of dancers I'm working with," she said.

Caitlin Osborne auditioned for Allied Motion Dance Co. in 2003 while living in State College. That audition turned into a longstanding friendship with Huckabee.

"I was in my early 30s when I started dancing, and I had a lot of dance training, but I felt at that time that I needed more development as a dancer, and she took me to the next level," Osborne said.

Osborne continued to work with Huckabee as the company's grant writer and the educational coordinator and joined the PSU Altoona staff in 2005 redesigning the dance program. She is also credited with founding the student program, the Ivyside Dance Co.

While Osborne no longer lives in Pennsylvania, she remains friends with Huckabee and supports the Allied Motion Dance Co.

"She always wants to put other people in positions where others can develop and grow, and she's amazing that way," Osborne said.

Likewise, Ana Lazendorfer, who came to the university in the early 2000s with previous dance experience, was quickly involved with Huckabee's classes and the Ivyside Dance Ensemble.

Calling Huckabee her mentor, Lazendorfer said she learned how to trust herself as a dancer after graduating and working as a principal dancer in Huckabee's business, Allied Motion Dance Co.

"I think she really helped me personally understand that better instead of trying to please the masses or meet other expectations," Lazendorfer said.

Stage exit

Looking back on 28 years, Huckabee expressed her gratitude for teaching dance at PSU Altoona.

One of her favorite performances includes her final recital by the Ivyside Dance Ensemble, named "Amor Fati (Love of Fate)," which explored the relationship between humans and mythological creatures.

"I'm very appreciative that I was able to create this dance minor and work with all of the students that I have throughout the years," she said.

Her influence also kept dance in the conversation at the university and local level.

"KT is a tireless advocate for artists and the arts at Penn State and in the community," said Erin Murphy, professor of English at Penn State Altoona and the 2026-27 University Laureate.

"She brings creativity, empathy and an exemplary work ethic to everything she does, whether

choreographing a dance or leading the college's performing arts program. I will miss her but am so very grateful for the legacy she has left behind."

The dance minor will continue at PSU Altoona after Huckabee's departure and she hopes the program will flourish and live beyond its initial development.

"This is a great program, and it's small enough. People get lots of personal attention, and we develop some really strong personal connections with our students," she said.

As a former student, Osborne reflected on Huckabee's talent and wished for her to continue her love of dance expression into her future endeavors.

"I hope she continues to create choreography, and it's that ability to nurture dancers that's her real gift," Osborne said.
